The shock of a burglarized house awaited me. After the police investigation, I informed Mboligihe. His family immediately came over to comfort me. They reminded me that this burglary can't steal the joy of what God is doing around the world through HWI. This experience also showed me God wants our obedience. He will take care of the rest.

We are amazed at what God is doing in and through HWI.

Togo Bound

"Can we take the two bikes you gave our boys back to Togo West Africa? We're packing the trailer for Pennsylvania and leaving today," came the question on the other end of the phone.
Russ, a Pediatrician, serves as a missionary. A year ago two of their boys got bikes from us to use during furlough. We were delighted to have the bikes go. Togo is the 7th country where HWI has bikes and trikes.

Later I called Russ and asked if he'd have room for a trike. When he came to get the trike, Kevin, our engineer, and I had the privilege of watching Russ's face light up with the idea of assisting the nationals to begin building trikes.

The day ended and I realized my plans didn't happen due to a pounding heart and the horrific summer heat, but God's plans did. I'm learning that sometimes doing less reaps more.

This summer our trike team has included physical therapists, occupational

He has donated all his time, talent and thousands of dollars for materials. In 2007 HWI was able to begin covering material costs.

Joni & Friends Family Retreat in Indiana

BJ told us, "Take the trike to Joni and Friends," BJ is a volunteer living with Down's syndrome. His planted seed was harvested between June 11-15 and June 18-22, 2007. Joni and Friends Retreat is for families dealing with disabilities.

BJ, Daniel (another HWI volunteer), and I went to the retreat along with 3 trikes. Kevin came one day to get input and try out 2 additional trikes.

"I haven't seen my husband so excited since his accident 4 years ago," a wife joyfully exclaimed. He was thrilled to ride.

"You have made our daughter so happy this week. We can't thank you enough," said Dawna. Anika, 8 years old, was adopted from Belarus about 4 years ago. Months after arriving she had surgery, which left her a



paraplegic.

Anika spent several hours riding trikes during retreat.

"Do you want to try the trike?" I asked a young man who was paralyzed on his right side. "I can't do it," he responded. When I offered to help him, he gladly tried.



The next day he brought friends back to watch him ride.

Words can't describe the joy of watching people ride a tricycle for the first time ever or since their injury.

Over 100 families were present for the combined 2 weeks of retreat.
